A Week in the Life of a Chaplain at a Shepherd's Canyon Retreat

As the Executive Director of Shepherd's Canyon Retreat, my primary responsibilities involve overseeing the ministry and raising awareness and financial support. My role is NOT to be a counselor. In fact, confidentiality is so well kept, that I usually don't even know the specific reasons of why most pastors, ministry workers & spouses come to our retreats.



Until recently, the only retreat I had personally attended was in February 2021, when my wife and I came during my own two-year battle with burnout and compassion fatigue. However, I was finally able to participate in my second retreat recently—this time as a chaplain—because one of our scheduled chaplains was unable to attend.

I loved every moment of it! It was an incredible experience to witness firsthand the inner workings of our retreats. I was impressed by the skill and dedication of our therapists and counselors, and it was so great to see the work of the Holy Spirit in many ways throughout the week. I especially enjoyed leading the participants in devotions twice a day and sharing some of the songs I had written during and after my own period of burnout.

<u>Monday</u> - The retreat began as participants arrived, including ministry leaders and spouses from five different states. We also had a male and a female therapist from Missouri and California.

Tuesday - Tuesday was "Story Day," a significant time when all seven participants shared the reasons they had come to the retreat. It was heart-wrenching to listen to their stories, filled with pain and struggles, yet it was a powerful reminder of why our ministry is so important.

<u>Wednesday</u> - On Wednesday, the group sessions took place in the morning, while the afternoons were dedicated to private counseling sessions, which do not include the chaplain. However, some participants scheduled time with me in the afternoon, either for spiritual reasons such as confession and absolution or to discuss logistical matters to me in my role as Executive Director, such as financial questions related to the retreat.

<u>Thursday</u> - Thursday followed a similar structure to Wednesday, but it also included a group activity where participants shared their stories through non-verbal methods. I was amazed by the powerful, emotional, effectiveness of this exercise. It revealed the deep emotions behind the facts shared on Tuesday in ways words often couldn't express.

Friday - Friday was a well-deserved day off for everyone. Participants were free to explore nearby Wickenburg or Prescott, or simply relax on campus. Many enjoyed walks, the hot tub, or the pool. (Future participants will enjoy our new high-quality massage chair, that was recently donated.) In the evening, we gathered for a meal on the roof of the Fellowship House, taking in the breathtaking starry Arizona sky.

<u>Saturday & Sunday</u> - Saturday & Sunday – were similar to Wednesday and Thursday except that we had a worship service in the prayer garden on Sunday morning (see photo) and a closing ceremony that evening.

<u>Monday</u> – On Monday, everyone left after breakfast with more joy in their faces than they did on the day they arrived. It was wonderful to see the transformation that had taken place in just one week. I am so glad I got to be a chaplain and I hope I get the opportunity to do it again sometime. **- Rev. 
